Curate's Corner: *A journey into the unknown*



The first two weeks in August saw Marlyn and myself leave the comforts of home for the unknown delights of Rwanda. We were on a journey to renew and build relationships with our partners in Shyogwe diocese in the southern province of this beautiful country. We did not know what to expect (other than the unexpected), despite good preparation with CMS Ireland and our fellow travellers from St. Marks Armagh and St. Donard's Belfast.

We were met at the airport by Bishop Jered and next day seven of us arrived on the outskirts of Muhanga in southern province. Our accommodation looked lovely from outside and we quickly got used to power cuts and no hot water. But the food was very good! Straight into our programme, we visited small churches up long dirt tracks and met with people full of the joy of the Lord.

We saw church building with mud bricks, people committed to God and each other, and an enthusiasm for reaching out to others and helping themselves. This is a diocese interested in helping its people to grow out of extreme poverty. They have nothing materially, but the joy of the Lord flows through them and they give thanks for everything. We have learned a lot from them.

Our programme included meeting with children and young people, as well as cell groups, Mothers Union and father's union. I had the pleasure of preaching in St. Matthias's church on the Sunday with an interpreter, and we even had shirts and

dresses made for us by the Mothers' Union.

Overall there are so many highlights and memories. We hope to arrange an evening to show some photos and let everyone know in more detail what we have learned and what we as a parish can do to help these wonderful brothers and sisters help themselves. The diocese has a truly holistic approach to 'church' and we really can learn so much from them: not least the way they put into practice the words from 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18.

To Be Opened In The Event...

The WW11 generation are fading; their memorabilia disposed of by new generations, taken from house clearances to the dump, or sold on eBay. Elderly relatives too, who have cherished things of the lost, and with the close of their lives in sight, wish to pass them on, in the hope that someone will continue to remember.

On the 4th May 1943, 596 aircraft raided Dortmund. 31 aircraft were lost, including a Halifax flown by a crew, on their 4th "op", who disappeared without trace. This crew had been on 78 Squadron, Bomber Command, for a fortnight. They are commemorated at Runnymede. The Navigator on this crew was 23 years old.

Recently, the last living relative of this young man donated his logbook to the local R.A.F. Association. When the logbook was opened, a letter written on RAF notepaper, was found, neatly folded, inside. This letter is something which I have often heard about, but never seen. A letter to be opened in the event of death. It had been read, and retained, by his Parents. It reads:

My Dearest Mother and Father, if perchance one day this life of mine should be snatched away I beg of you have no fear. If I were to say that I were not afraid for myself you would consider it foolish bravado, but I am not afraid. This life of ours, this mere existence, is just a prelude to something greater.

You know, we are fighting for something greater than either you or I, we are fighting for God's cause. In this, a so called civilised world, we have forgotten, yes we have forgotten that there is a God in heaven. We have all been too wrapped up in ourselves and have considered our own selfish selves rather than God.

When I look upon my brief life I find I have achieved nothing, but now I have my chance, for what is more glorious than to

die for the cause of God. My friends and I, despite the fact we have never discussed it, know we are fighting not only for freedom, but for something greater. We are all afraid physically, who would not be, but not spiritually, for we know it is in God's name we die. Up to now we have never considered dying and even now we do not discuss it, but it's there all the same. We may seem miserable too, perhaps many of us consider we have not lived our lives, but this life has brought us closer to the love of God, much closer than ever before. We feel no hatred or bitterness, only a feeling that God is at our side. Even in the Mess where talk of flying is taboo, and the radio blares incessantly, the spirit lives with us, that spirit and the love of God that will lead us and those that follow after, to greater and better things.

But a far greater task lies with you. You must see that this spirit which is guiding us now does not die when this bitter struggle is over. Rather you must build up and cherish that spirit within the hearts of people throughout the world.

"Put your hand into the hand of God and go out into the unknown" as the famous words run and they are the keystone to our inspiration, for to whom else can we turn?
